Seadog Cruises Launches Speedboat Sightseeing Tours On Potomac River

Waterfront Tours Depart National Harbor Beginning May 2008

WASHINGTON, D.C. (May 1, 2008) - Seadog Cruises, popular speedboat sightseeing tours that have been departing Chicago's Navy Pier since 1996 to the delight of more than 1 million passengers, is adding a new dock - National Harbor, Maryland. Beginning May 10, 2008, people will be able to experience the thrill and excitement of speedboat tours on the Potomac River.

Seadog Cruises is part of the brand portfolio of parent company Entertainment Cruises, the largest dining and entertainment cruise company in the United States. Entertainment Cruises, which serves 1.5 million guests annually with a fleet of 24 ships in eight cities, also operates Odyssey Cruises and Spirit Cruises in Washington, D.C.

Seadog will offer a 45-Minute Speedboat and Sightseeing Tour. This exciting tour includes informative descriptions of notable landmarks as Old Town Alexandria, the Wilson Bridge, Jones Point Lighthouse, Ft. Washington and Mt. Vernon. Upbeat music is also a part of the entertainment onboard. The 70-foot open-air speedboat, powered by twin turbo-charged diesel engines that produce 1800 horsepower, travels at speeds up to 32 knots (36.8 mph). The vessel accommodates up to 100 passengers, is handicap accessible and lavatory equipped. A 70-Minute Monument Tour is also available for groups of 20 or more.

Cruise Schedule

The cruises, which will operate from May through October, will be offered every hour from 11am - 8pm on Tuesday - Sunday, and will also run on Memorial Day and Labor Day. Tickets are \$20.00 for adults and \$15.00 for children ages 3 to 11. Military discounts are offered with ID. Discounts will also apply for groups of 20 or more. Private charters are also available.

"Seadog Cruises is one of the most popular waterfront attractions in Chicago and we expect it to be the same in this area," said Sal Naso, vice president and general manager of Entertainment Cruises' ships in the Washington, D.C. metro area. "We are delighted to bring these tours to National Harbor," he said.
